Philadelphia), New Delhi, (d) Researcher with Indian Social Institute on Kandhamal Violence in Orissa in 2007-08 (ISI, New Delhi), (e) Assistant Professor in the Centre for Anthropological Studies, Central University of Orissa (2009-2013) and Assistant Professor, Department of Contemporary and Tribal Customary Law, Central University of Jharkhand (2013-22).
