Introduction

Pandit Nilakantha Das was a renowned Philosopher, humanist, and social activist from Odisha, whose contributions to Philosophy, literature, and social thought continue to inspire. Known for his deep understanding of ancient texts and his rational approach to traditional concepts, Nilakantha sought to bridge the gap between timeless spiritual wisdom and modern societal needs. His work is particularly noted for its focus on the concept of dharma and its relevance to both individual and collective well-being. In two of his religio-philosophical writings, Srimad Bhagavad Gītā and The Cult of Jagannātha, he presents a detailed discussion on the concept and types of dharma and emphasizes mānava dharma. Alongside his works, in honor of his memory, there is an institution in Bhubaneswar, 'Pandita Nilakantha Smrti Samiti,' which regularly publishes books and articles authored by teachers of Philosophy and literature on his Philosophy and contributions to literature.

In this two-day national seminar, we will explore Nilakantha Das's humanist Philosophy, emphasizing his interpretation of dharma as the continuous expansion of the human mind, leading to oneness with creation. His analysis of key Gita concepts such as Purusottama, karma, and svadharma offers a fresh perspective, urging us to reconsider them not only as theological ideas but also as essential socio-ethical principles for guiding modern society. Through his writings, Nilakantha highlighted the importance of aligning with the moral and natural orders, stressing that a proper understanding of dharma is vital for the harmony of both human society and the universe.

This seminar will provide an in-depth analysis of his philosophical views and their enduring relevance in today's world, promoting a humanistic approach to addressing contemporary challenges.

Major Objectives of the theme are to:

- Examine Nilakantha Das's views on the classification of dharma.
- Analyze his humanistic and rationalistic perspectives on dharma and mānava dharma.
- Explore his understanding of svadharma with a focus on mānava dharma.
- Investigate how ātmika dharma, being non-different from mānava dharma, can be considered humanistic rather than spiritualistic.
- Assess the perspectives of scholars who regard him as an advocate of naturalistic philosophy.
- Rationally justify his view that Jagannath dharma represents the 'religion of humanity.'
